

**Brief description:**

It was followed by an informative PPT presentation that consisted of all the activities done by the NSS unit of our college throughout the year. Thereafter, 53 girls registered with My Bharat portal. They were also registered with University of Calcutta and were added to the NSS official WhatsApp group to keep them informed of all the upcoming events and activities. **Brief Description-** The NSS Unit of University of Calcutta, COSU, SWC and LTS units of our college organized a Blood Donation Camp at the college campus to educate students about the importance, safety, and impact of blood donation. The external partners of the blood donation camp were the Lions Club and Blood Connect. The camp drew enthusiasm among students and teachers alike. The Lions Club sent an able team of doctors, nurses and paramedics to carry out the session. 116 students from various streams had registered for the event. Each donor was subjected to a thorough medical check-up and was permitted to donate blood only if considered fit. 80 units of blood were collected. The donors were provided with some rest and refreshments. Certificates were also given to each donor.

**Outcome:** The program invoked a positive spirit among students urging them to understand the significance of donating blood for saving millions of lives suffering from chronic and terminal diseases. The program was successful in pooling 80 units of blood to help the people in need. The program further strengthened the NSS volunteers' sense of social responsibility

and promoted the spirit of cooperation through community engagement. It paved the way for organizing future voluntary blood donation drives at the college.






