- BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE EVENT: The Special Lecture explored Rabindranath Tagore's profound and nuanced reflections on nationalism. Moving beyond narrow political definitions, the session examined Tagore's emphasis on humanism, ethical freedom and universalism and his vision of the world rooted in mutual respect and cultural dialogue.
- OUTCOME: The students are expected to develop a deeper understanding of Rabindranath Tagore's critique of nationalism and his alternative vision grounded in humanism and universal values. Students will be able to critically distinguish between ethical patriotism and relate Tagore's ideas to contemporary social and political contexts, and enhance their critical thinking and interpretive skills through engagement with philosophical and literary texts.
