Brief Description of Event: The Department of Political Science observed Constitution Day, commemorating the adoption of the Indian Constitution on November 26, 1949. This year, the theme chosen for the celebration was Justice. Dr Mandar Mukherjee, a Former Associate Professor of the Department, was the guest speaker who delivered a speech on “Constitution: A Justice to Democracy”, outlining how the fundamental provisions of the document orient the polity to impart justice to the people. Subsequently, the student gave a brief presentation on the various provisions of the Constitution that shape the delivery of justice in criminal cases. Additionally, students were invited to recite their self-composed poems on the theme, followed by a debate on “Bulldozer Justice”, which was judged by Dr Devaleena Sinha and Smt. Alpana Nayak from the Departments of History and Hindi, respectively. Finally, students of the department reviewed ‘justice’ as a concept through a visual review, highlighting procedural, redistributive, and restorative justice in Indian Cinema.

Outcome: The multiple events held on Constitution Day, 2025, enabled more participatory engagement with the Constitution. Beyond the syllabus, the events focused on the exploration of constitutional values in everyday life, in particular, justice.
