Brief Description of the Event

Central Research Committee and IQAC of the college organised an Orientation programme for the students with WWF-India (World Wide Fund for Nature-India) which is one of the country's premier conservation organizations, headquartered in New Delhi. Established in 1969 as a Charitable Trust, it works to protect critical ecosystems, conserve key wildlife species, and mitigate the impacts of climate change.

The orientation programme focussed on the present activities of the organisation such as :

- Protecting iconic Indian wildlife, such as the Royal Bengal Tiger in the Sundarbans, snow leopards in the Himalayas, and elephants, by tracking movements and preserving natural corridors.
- Assists highly vulnerable communities (like those in the Sundarbans and the Ganga Basin) in implementing climate-resilient livelihoods, such as salt-tolerant farming.
- Works with local industries and agricultural frameworks.

Learning outcomes:

Students develop a deep understanding of local ecosystems, climate change, and biodiversity loss. Students may become volunteers and gain hands-on experience through field visits, citizen science projects, and specialized course modules . Students are empowered to become changemakers and youth leaders, taking measurable action on issues like plastic pollution.
