## TASK 2- Exercise: The Power Of Observation

Exercise 1: Observing a Familiar Object (20 minutes)

Object: Your Smartphone/ Coffee Mug; Focus: Physical details and personal reactions.

## **Instructions:**

- 1. Find a Quiet Spot: Choose a place where you won't be distracted.
- 2. Observe Your Smartphone/ Coffee Mug (10 minutes):
  - Look closely at its design, buttons, and screen.
  - Notice any emotions or thoughts that come up while you observe.
- 3. Capture Your Observations:
  - **Example:**
  - ❖ Visuals: Take clear photos of your smartphone from various angles (front, back, sides) and zoom in on specific features (buttons, camera, screen). ■
  - Written Notes: Document observations such as:
    - > Design: "The sleek, minimalist design feels modern and user-friendly. \*\*
    - ➤ Material: "The glass back gives it a premium look but makes it fragile. ♥"
    - > Features: "The camera is equipped with three lenses, perfect for photography.
    - ➤ Personal Reaction: "Using this phone enhances my daily routine; it feels like an extension of myself. ""
    - ♦ Multimedia: Record a short video (10-20 seconds) of you using the phone, highlighting specific features (like the camera in action). ▶

## OR

**Example: Coffee Mug -** As you observe the coffee mug, you might note:

- Design: "The mug has a curved handle that fits comfortably in my hand."
- Material: "It's made of ceramic, giving it a solid, sturdy feel."
- Color: "It's bright red with white speckles, which makes it stand out."
- Personal Reaction: "Using this mug makes my morning coffee feel more special; it feels cozy."
- 4. Create a Simple Multimedia Presentation:
  - Example:
    - Slides: Use a presentation tool to organize your observations.
  - Slide 1: Title slide with the smartphone's name/ coffee mug image.
  - Slide 2: Photos of the smartphone/ coffee mug with captions detailing its features.
  - Slide 3: Key observations written in bullet points about design, material, and personal impact.

E.g.- "This is my coffee mug. I noticed its design makes it ergonomic, which enhances user experience. The bright color not only makes it visually appealing but also influences my mood positively when I drink from it."

- Encourage questions from classmates: "How do you think design affects your choice of everyday items?"
- Slide 4: Include a video clip showcasing a feature in use, like taking a photo.
- Visual Design: Use contrasting colors and readable fonts to enhance clarity.
